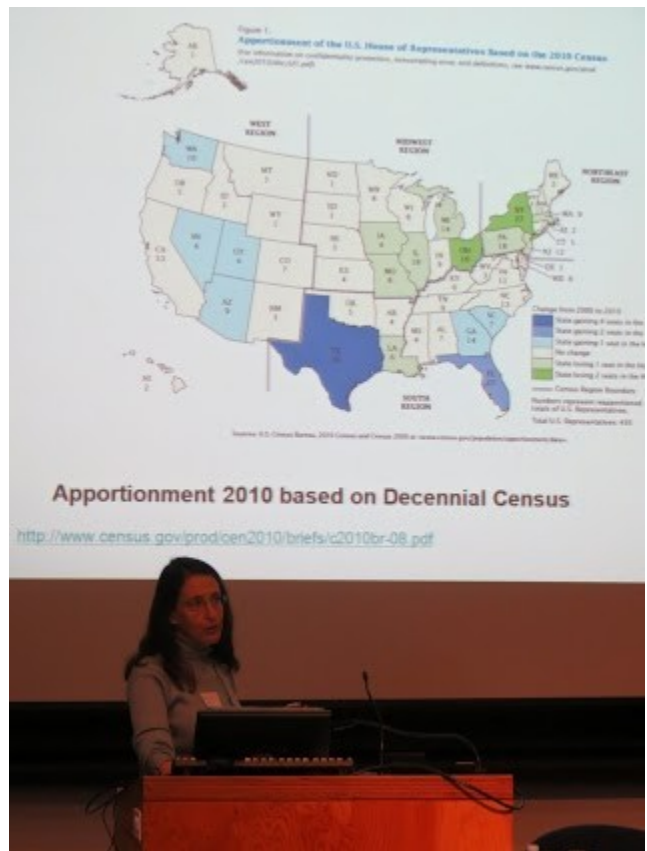
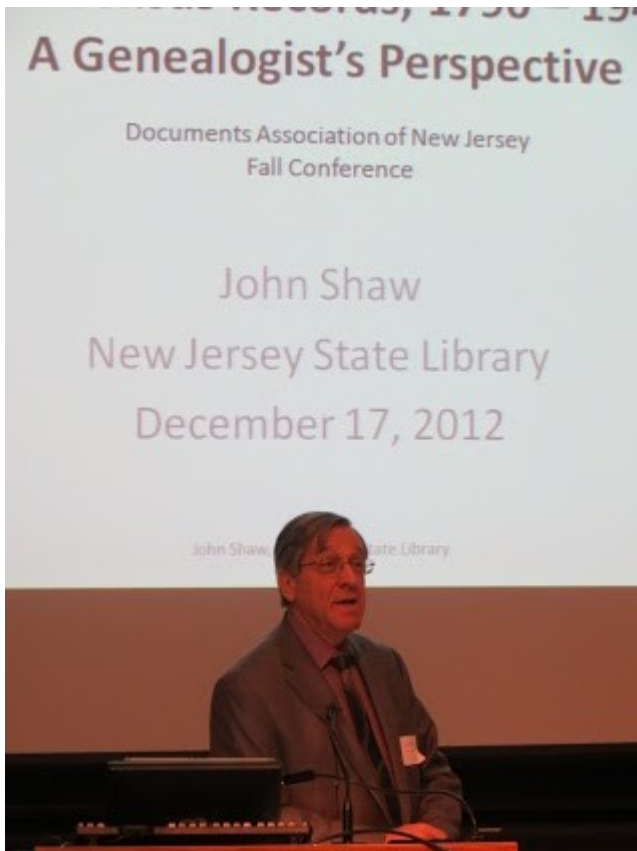

New Jersey Documents Updates

Deborah Mercer, New Jersey Government Documents Librarian at the New Jersey State Library and chair of the DANJ New Jersey Interest Group, has been working with [Assemblyman Ramos to change the Floor Amendment of A3490](#) that was adopted March 21, 2013.

The relevant piece of that amendment would have eliminated the need for agencies to supply the State Library with six printed copies of what State agencies post online.

“Printed versions of legislative documents are still the official version in most states. But digital versions of statutes, administrative rules and other legal and legislative documents are gaining broad use in the legal and legislative community, and in some cases, may be the only version. To address concerns about online-only legal resources, the Uniform Law Commission in July 2011 approved the [Uniform Electronic Legal Material Act \(UELMA\)](#). It provides for the authentication and preservation of certain electronic legal materials. California and Colorado adopted the act in 2012.
