



- Thematic access to the UN and partners:
 - <http://www.unsceb.org/alpha> - **Alphabetic Listing of UN System Organizations and Entities** allows you to browse UN and UN related agencies. Open up the **+CEB** option at the bottom of the page for thematic access to websites, documents, news, bookmarks and more.
 - <http://www.un.org/en/globalissues/index.shtml> - **United Nations Global Issues** also provides access via thematic issues. Use the links on the upper right hand side of the page for related resources.
- www.un.org/en/ - The **UN Welcome** page provides direct access to the five main functions of the United Nations: *Peace and Security; Development; Human Rights; Humanitarian Affairs; International Law*. Within each function, this site groups together UN bodies, thematic issues related to each function and links to other relevant UN resources. A useful page on this site is the *Structure and Organization of the UN*: <http://www.un.org/en/aboutun/structure/index.shtml>.
- <http://data.un.org/> - **UNdata** allows you to search across numerous statistical databases maintained by the UN and UN related organizations. Search by keyword, by country or browse data sets related to specific databases.
- <http://www.un.org/en/databases/> provides a list of **United Nations databases**, grouped by: *Official Documents and Bibliographic Databases (including ODS and UNbisnet); Treaties, Declarations and Legislative Sources; UN Members; Terminology; Multimedia; Civil Society; Climate Change; Human Rights Issues; Humanitarian Issues; Non-governmental Organizations (NGOs); Statistical Data; Conferences and Events; Archives*.
- <http://research.un.org/en/docs/> - The **Dag Hammarskjold Library** offers its own research guides; these are very helpful.
- <http://unyearbook.un.org/> - **Yearbook of the United Nations** is online and searchable by keyword; provides an authoritative overview of the UN's yearly activity from 1946 onward. The downside with the *Yearbook* is that it lags behind in publication by about 5 years.
